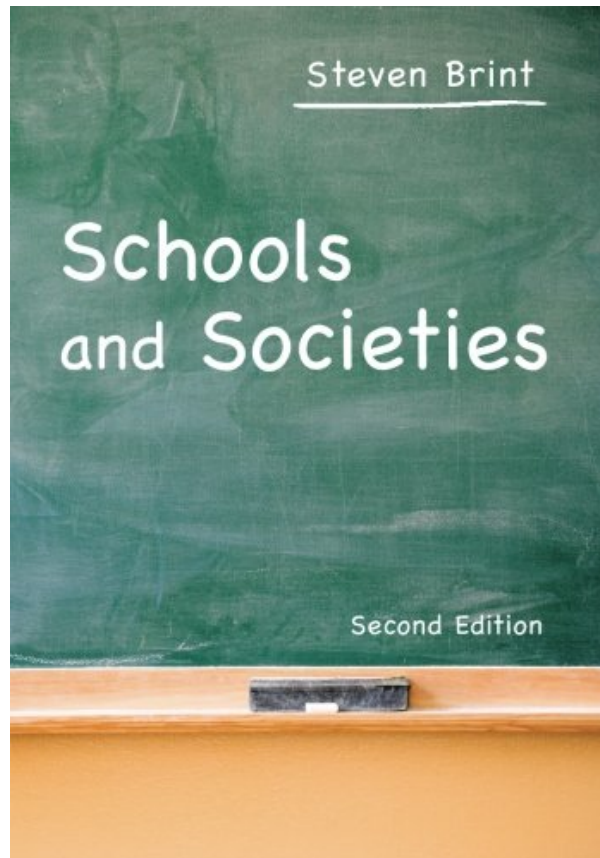
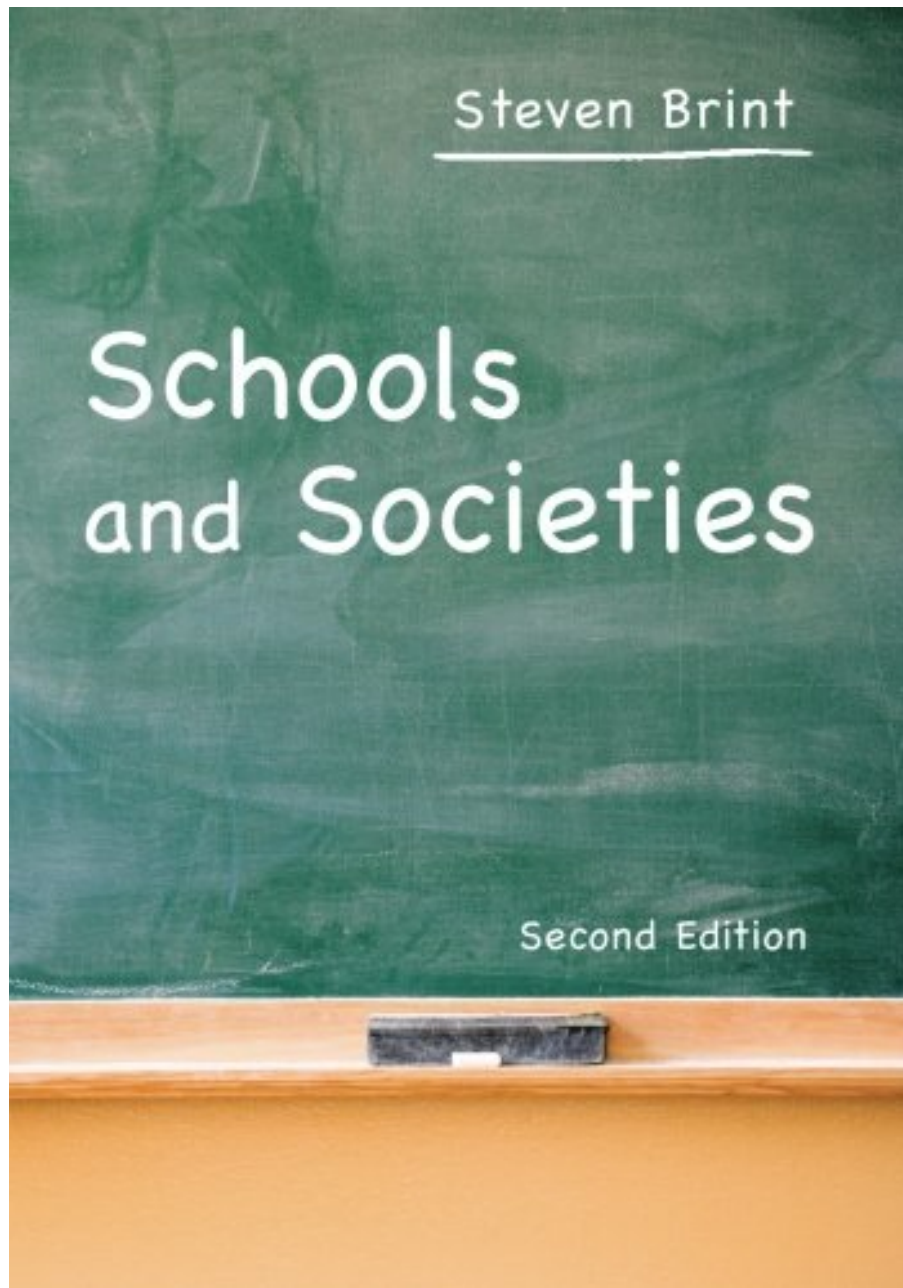

The book displays inconsistencies in thinking, and many seeming uninformed statements in the chapters on inequality.
